Indian agriculture is facing several challenges for producing more food to feed growing population. Improving agricultural production while conserving and enhancing natural resources is another problem in Indian agriculture. The solution lies in changing scenario is sustain ability in agriculture production. In India, where the average farm size is small and poverty and food insecurity remain prevalent among small landholders, the concept of sustainable agriculture should be viewed in the context of the need to improve agricultural productivity, production, and profitability, as well as to improve the economic conditions of small landholders. Innovative digital technologies can also enable precise use of resources, including water, protecting, and enhancing the natural resource base while increasing productivity. The main objective of conducting this conference is to evaluate the past research efforts in management of natural resources for sustainable development and rural livelihood, to streamline future scientific efforts in support of sustainable agriculture and livelihood security, to draw the recommendations for capacity building and creating development opportunities for farming communities in land, forests, water and digitization of agriculture.
